



15 EASY and EFFECTIVE WAYS TO USE STICKERS FOR BEGINNER WRITERS

Kids love stickers! Here's a list of ways to use stickers from ages 2-3 to avid writing.

1. FINE MOTOR

The child removes stickers and sticks them on a piece of paper (or anywhere).



2. DRAWING STRAIGHT LINES

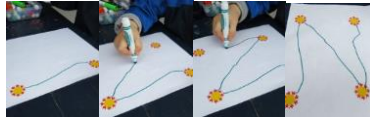
The child sticks two stickers then draws a straight line to connect the two stickers.



3. DRAWING CAPITAL LETTERS THAT HAVE STRAIGHT LINES

(A, E, F, H, I, K, L, M, N, T, V, W, X, Y and Z)

Place the stickers so that the child can draw capital letters. Place two stickers first. Then, add one at a time until the letter is complete.



4. DRAWING CIRCLES

Place a sticker on a piece of paper. Have the child start at the top and draw a COUNTERCLOCKWISE circle around it. This leads to write letters that have curves and counterclockwise circles. (C, G, O, S, a, c, d, g, o, q)



5. CIRCLING VOCABULARY

Place 3 stickers. Teach the words 1st, 2nd, 3rd OR left, middle, right OR the names of objects. Instruct the child to circle the 1st stickers or middle sticker or the sailboat etc. Make sure the child's circles start at the top and move COUNTERCLOCKWISE.



6. BEGINNING SOUNDS OR WORDS

Write a letter on a piece of paper. The child places stickers that begin with that letter.





7. SIMPLE SIGHT WORDS

Teach the sight words A and THE. Have the child write the word A and stick a sticker. Repeat many times. Once the child has learned "A" well, proceed to the word THE.



8. NUMBERS and COUNTING

Write the numbers 1-10 on separate sheets of paper. Have the child place that number of stickers for each page.



9. WRITING NUMBERS

The child places a number of stickers on a page, then writes the number.



10. WRITING NUMBER WORDS

The child places a number of stickers on a page, then writes the number word.



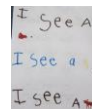
11. PHONETIC SPELLING

The child places a sticker, says the word slowly, then writes the sounds that he/she hears.



12. WRITING SIMPLE SIGHT WORD SENTENCES

The child writes a sight word sentence and fills in the blank with a sticker.



13. WRITING ONE COMPLETE SENTENCE

The child places a sticker and writes any one sentence about it.



14. WRITING 2-3 SENTENCES

The child places a sticker and writes any 2-3 sentences about it.



15. WRITING A STORY

The child places a sticker and writes a story about it.
