

Apples to Apples Speaking Version



Apples to Apples can be used as a speaking game to accompany persuasive writing since the game involves persuading a judge to choose your card. It also works well with parts of speech since the entire game involves adjectives and nouns.

How to play!

- 1. Divide the group into pairs.
- 2. Designate one pair to serve as judges. They stand at the front of the room with the green cards (ADJECTIVES).



3. Give 5 red cards (NOUNS) to each pair.



- 4. The judges read the adjective on one green card.
- 5. Each pair has to choose a red card (NOUN) that they think best fits the adjective. They have to come up with 1-3 reasons (depending on age of the group) why their noun should be chosen.
- 6. The judges hear each pair, then choose a winner. The winning pair becomes the next judges.
- 7. Continue play until each pair has had a Chance to be judge or the allotted time runs out!
