

THREE REASONS

The core of writing a persuasive piece is supporting your opinion with three main points or reasons. This is a game to practice that!

NOTE: This lesson can address the following Common Core State Standards: CCSS.ELA.LITERACY.W.K.1, W.1.1, W.2.1, W.3.1, W.3.1.A, W.3.1.B, W.4.1, W.4.1.A, W.4.1.B, W.5.1, W.5.1.A and W.5.1.B.

Setting up the game:

1. For smaller groups (up to 8), divide the board into 4 sections. Assign a pair to each section.



2. For larger groups, divide the group into pairs. Give each pair a small white board, dry erase marker and a sock to serve as an eraser.




Now to play!

3. Make a statement.

"There are many things Children Can do to earn money."

4. The students race to write three reasons that support the statement.





- 5. The students face you or hold up their whiteboard.
- 6. Check to make sure each reason fits the statement. If so, give them a thumbs up. If not, point out what doesn't fit so they can replace it.
- 7. If time, let the students share their reasons each turn!
- 8. Continue play until your allotted time runs out!
