

RING TOSS INSTRUCTIONS

Below is an example of what an older writer might write.

Make note that while most of the student's words will be spelled correctly, some may not be and that's okay. The goal is that the student writes out the steps in order and explains each step with details.

Have you ever thought about what children played with way back when? Imagine a ring toss made out of a stick and long reeds of grass!

Materials:

1 stick from the yard or a popsicle stick

1 pipe cleaner

1 piece of yarn about 24" long

Instructions:

First, go outside and find a small, sturdy stick.

Next, cut a pipe cleaner into two equal parts.

Form one half into a circle.

Tightly twist the ends of the pipe cleaner around the circle.

Then, cut a piece of yarn so that it's 24 inches long. Tie one end of the yarn to the circle. Tie the other end of the yarn to the stick. Last, hold the stick in one hand. Swing the ring up into the air and try to catch it onto the end of your stick. Count how many times you catch it!

The next time you feel bored, make a ring toss or try to imagine a world without toys and create something fun.
