

SWEET DREAMS

This lesson can be taught anytime of the year using any candy or sweet treat. For the Christmas season, you can use candy canes!

Now for the lesson!

- 1. Start off by telling your students the title of the lesson, SWEET DREAMS.
- 2. Have your students tell a dream that they remember to you or a classmate.
- 3. Tell the storyline: You're going to write about a dream that has candy canes in it. Anything can happen in your dream! You just have to incorporate candy canes in some way.
- 4. Brainstorm characteristics of dreams:
 - a. Familiar place that is different
 - b. Famous people
 - c. Flying
 - d. Try to do something but can't (see, hear, talk...)
 - e. Falling
 - f. Etc.
- 5. Show the five sections:
- a. Introduction and Place
- b. Actions
- c. Problem
- d. Attempt
- e. Ending
- 6. Remember: K-1st Graders are encouraged to write 1 sentence for each section, 2nd Graders 2 sentences, 3rd Graders 3 sentences and so on.

Now to write!

Guide the students through the following steps. They are free to use the suggestions or write their own words.

- 1. Introduction: Last night, I had the _____est dream. (strangest, best, scariest, craziest, silliest, funniest...)
- 2. Describe the place. I was in/at...
- 3. Describe your actions. I was...
- 4. Show the problem. All of a sudden...
- 5. Show your attempt. I tried to but
- 6. Write the ending. Just as I was about to....I woke up.
