Just to recap:

1. Once a child has learned how to spell the sight words in [LIST 11](#), you can begin teaching him/her how to write and read these sentences.
2. **At this point, many children can work on 2-3 sentences per week. You can use one that is listed here, plus two that you create based on words your student misspells in his/her free writing.**
3. The child should know how to spell all of the SIGHT WORDS in the sentence before moving onto the next sentence. The underline words DO NOT need to be spelled correctly to move on.
4. The underlined words can be replaced with different words to teach vocabulary.
5. The word families are there to teach a specific spelling pattern.

There will be an opportunity to present your idea on February 6th, 2021.

Focus on capitalizing months and adding a comma between the day and year.

"Which vegetables do you recommend?" the woman asked. Vocabulary: nouns (people)

Word Family: ___able, capable, comfortable, doable, reliable, vegetable

Beginning this week, we will walk for approximately 30 min. each day.

Focus on the comma after "week" and the period after "min."

Exercises will include hopping, running and swimming. Vocabulary: Exercises

Focus on the short vowels and double consonants, hopping, running, stopping, swimming

We actually don't need any equipment today.

Vocabulary: Verbs

Word Family: ___ment, advertisement, entertainment, government, management...

The team accidentally forgot to bring the bats.

Vocabulary: Sports equipment

Word Family: ___ally, accidentally, actually, annually, occasionally, personally, generally...

The team was surprised, embarrassed and frustrated. Vocabulary: feelings

Word Family: "ise" sounds like "ize", advised, comprised, exercised, surprised...

The parents consciously separated the twins in school to encourage independence.

Word Family: ___ence, absence, audience, difference, evidence, presence, sentence...



The student government is organized and consistently displays good character.

Vocabulary: synonyms for "good", admirable, appropriate, honorable, respectable...

My friend, Amy, is responsible, courageous and encouraging.

Focus on the comma before and after the name and different character traits.

In your opinion, does a business need privilege to succeed?

Focus on spelling the words opinion, business, privilege and succeed.

Soldiers courageously enter dangerous situations.

Word Family: ___ous, courageous, dangerous, generous, prosperous...

Practice safety whenever you go swimming.

Vocabulary: activities

Word Family: ___ice, advice, office, justice, notice, practice, service...

The doctor's office had a clean and friendly environment.

Vocabulary: adjectives

Review the apostrophe "s" that indicates possession
