

SIGHT WORD SENTENCES LIST 12

Just to recap:

- 1. Once a child has learned how to spell the sight words in <u>LIST 11</u>, you can begin teaching him/her how to write and read these sentences.
- 2. At this point, many children can work on 2-3 sentences per week. You can use one that is listed here, plus two that you create based on words your student misspells in his/her free writing.
- 3. The child should know how to spell all of the SIGHT WORDS in the sentence before moving onto the next sentence. The underline words DO NOT need to be spelled correctly to move on.
- 4. The underlined words can be replaced with different words to teach vocabulary.
- 5. The word families are there to teach a specific spelling pattern.

There will be an opportunity to present your idea on <u>February 6th</u>, 2021. Focus on capitalizing months and adding a comma between the day and year.

'Which vegetables do you recommend?" the <u>woman</u> asked. Vocabulary: nouns (people) Word Family:able, capable, comfortable, doable, reliable, vegetable
Beginning this week, we will <u>walk</u> for approximately 30 min. each day. Focus on the comma after "week" and the period after "min."
Exercises will include hopping , running and swimming. Vocabulary: Exercises Focus on the short vowels and double consonants, hopping, running, stopping, swimming
We actually don't <u>need</u> any equipment today. Vocabulary: Verbs Word Family:ment, advertisement, entertainment, government, management
The team accidentally forgot to bring the <u>bats</u> . Vocabulary: Sports equipment Word Family:ally, accidentally, actually, annually, occasionally, personally, generally
The team was surprised, embarrassed and <u>frustrated</u> . Vocabulary: feelings Word Family: "ise" sounds like "ize", advised, comprised, exercised, surprised
The parents consciously separated the twins <u>in school</u> to encourage independence. Word Family: ence absence audience difference evidence presence sentence
