THE CHIEF AND THE THIEF

This is a fun story to help students learn which words are spelled with IE (rather than EI). NOTE: This lesson can address the following Common Core State Standards: CCSS.ELA-Literacy.W.K.3, W.1.3, W.2.3, W.3.3, W.3.3.A, W.3.3.B, W.3.3.C, W.3.3.D, W.4.3.A, W.4.3.B, W.4.3.C, W.4.3.D, W.4.3.E, W.5.3, W.5.3.A, W.5.3.B, W.5.3.C, W.5.3.D and W.5.3.E

Now for the lesson!

1. Tell the students the storyline: "Today, we're going to learn a list of words that are spelled with IE (rather than EI). Then, we're going write a story about a chief and a thief."

Teach and list words that have IE in them:

Characters: Adjectives: Settings:

Piece of pie Shield Reactions/Actions

2. Show the 5 Sections:

Characters/Setting On-going Problem

Reactions/Actions Solution/Conclusion

3. Show the expectations:

K-1st Graders are encouraged to write 1 sentence for each section, 2nd Graders-2 sentences, 3rd Graders-3 sentences, 4th Graders-4 sentences, 5th Graders-5 sentences

Now to write: Guide the students through the following steps so their story is organized and complete. They are free to write these ideas in their own words. There is a 2nd Grade example in italics for your own guidance.

- 1. Introduce the characters and settings. Once there was a chief and a thief. They were best friends.
- 2. Describe an on-going problem or situation. They both wanted to eat a piece of pie at the top of a glacier. They decided to do it.
- 3. Write about a specific event. They packed a pie and a shield. They pierced the ice.
- 4. Write about the characters' reactions and actions. They climbed the glacier. Then, they ate the pie.
- 5. Write the solution and conclusion. The world couldn't believe it. Everyone was relieved when the chief and thief got home.
