THEIR WEIRD (OR FEISTY) NEIGHBORS

This is a fun story to help students learn which words are spelled with EI (rather than IE). NOTE: This lesson can address the following Common Core State Standards: CCSS.ELA-Literacy.W.K.3, W.1.3, W.2.3, W.3.3, W.3.3,

Now for the lesson!

- 1. Tell the students the storyline: "Today, we're going to learn a list of words that are spelled with El (rather than IE). Then, we're going write a story about a family's weird, or feisty, neighbors."
- 2. Teach and list words that have EI in them:

3. Show the 5 Sections:

Introduction: Family and Weird Neighbors

One day, All of a sudden, Reactions/Actions Solution/Conclusion

4. Show the expectations:

K-1st Graders are encouraged to write 1 sentence for each section, 2nd Graders-2 sentences, 3rd Graders-3 sentences, 4th Graders-4 sentences, 5th Graders-5 sentences

Now to write: Guide the students through the following steps so their story is organized and complete. They are free to write these ideas in their own words. There is a 2nd Grade example in italics for your own guidance.

- 1. Describe the family and their weird neighbors. The Manning's lived in New York. Their neighbors were weird.
- 2. Describe a normal day that included weird habits. Their neighbors had eight beige flowers. They only ate caffeine and protein.
- 3. Write about a sudden weird moment. One day, they hung eight weights from their ceiling. Suddenly, their ceiling fell.
- 4. Write about the weird reactions and actions. They measured the height of their house. They hung eight swings from the roof.
- 5. Write a weird solution and conclusion. They never fixed their ceiling. They started carrying the eight weights everywhere.
